
The 2016 Key Stage 2 assessments are the first ones to assess the new (much more challenging) National Curriculum. It was introduced in September 2014.

Teacher assessments are based on the standards in the <u>interim</u> <u>framework</u>. The new tests and interim frameworks have been introduced to reflect the revised curriculum. Results are no longer reported as levels and each pupil will now receive their results as a 'scaled score'.



Due to the changes set out above and the differences in the curriculum, assessment figures for 2016 are not comparable to those of earlier years. The expectations for pupils at the end of Key Stage 2 have been raised significantly – in particular, the removal of a 'best fit' approach has had a significant impact on teacher assessment for writing.


