## Reflections on Pupil Premium Spending 2016-17

Intervention	Cost	Impact of Spending
<b>Breakfast Club</b>	£5795	80% of Pupil Premium eligible children regularly attended the breakfast club. The average attendance of PP eligible children rose from 93.24% (2015/16) to 94.54% (2016/17).
<b>Speech and Language</b>	£19,514	45% of the children who worked with our internal, speech and language specialist are eligible for PP. Other Teaching Assistants have received training in this area in order to support all children who are eligible for PP.
<b>Writing Intervention</b>	£19,996	100% of Year Two and Year Six children received an intensive support programme with well-respected former Head teacher and English specialist. Almost half of PP eligible children achieved the expected standard in writing (compared to 20% of pupils last academic year). Bespoke Alan Peat training for all staff to adapt to the new curriculum – the impact of this training will be evident next year.
<b>Subject Specialists</b>	£18,600	100% of PP eligible children took part in lessons taken by a specialist teacher and all of the children participated in our school's musical production – this included African drumming, singing, dancing and poetry. 100% of PP pupils in Year 5 were selected to support OBA High School with their Christmas production.
<b>Behaviour support</b>	£858	10 pupils with a variety of additional behavioural needs were given specialist support to improve their behaviour. All Year Six pupils, some of which were removed from the classroom in 15/16, were able to take part in SATS Assessments. 'Fixed Exclusions Sessions' went down from <b>56 (2016 Census) to 4 (2017 Census)</b> .
<b>Lunchtime Club</b>	£1,680	100% of PP eligible children were invited to a weekly Lunchtime Nurturing Club. 80% of these pupils chose to attend regularly.
<b>Gardening Club</b>	£1,445	All PP pupils experienced enrichment lessons with a professional gardener.
<b>Sports Coaching</b>	£3,800	All PP pupils took part in weekly sports coaching/PE lessons using specialist equipment (unattainable in normal circumstances). 75% of pupils attended after club sports clubs regularly. 24% of all PP eligible pupils represented the school in tournaments and showcases across Halton.
<b>Choir</b>	£3,659	56% of PP eligible pupils received professional singing lessons on a weekly basis. 10 PP pupils attended and took part in the 'Young Voices' concert at the Manchester Arena.
<b>Teaching Assistants</b>	17,973	Each class had at least 1 teaching assistant every day. 100% of PP children have been targeted with interventions to aid progress. <b>End of Key Stage results and Y1 phonics results for disadvantaged children are presented in separate reports. These can also be viewed on the school website.</b>
