

Windmill Hill Primary School Pupil Premium Report to parents School Year 2014/15

Pupil Premium was introduced in April 2011 and paid for by a specific grant based on school census figures for those children eligible for free school meals from Reception to Y11.

At Windmill Hill:

We ensure that teaching and learning opportunities meet the needs of **all** pupils.

We ensure that appropriate provision is made for pupils who belong to vulnerable groups, including those who might be considered to be socially disadvantaged, in order to raise the standard of achievement of these pupils.

Pupil Premium will be allocated following a needs analysis which will identify priority classes, groups or individuals.

All our work through Pupil Premium will be aimed at accelerating progress moving children forward in order to achieve their full potential.

School Policy:

The Headteacher and the Governing Body have agreed a policy for Pupil Premium to guide the use of funds and to ensure that it represents value for money.

Provision:

Providing small group work with experienced staff focussing on overcoming gaps in learning.

1:1 support

Additional teaching and learning opportunities provided through external agencies.

In 2014-15 the Pupil Premium funding allocation across the academic year was $\pounds104,014$.

Pupil premium allocation for 2014/15 was targeted on:

- 1. Providing a free Breakfast Club.
- 2. Teaching Assistants in all classes
- 3. Intensive programme in **Writing** for small groups with an experienced provider.
- 4. All children at Windmill Hill are given high quality provision from professionals in **music**, **dance**, **drama**, **sport** and **French**.
- 5. Funding of a Speech and Language Therapist
- 6. Funding of a Behaviour Support specialist
- 7. Funding towards a **member of staff** to work with small groups of SEN children.
- 8. Lunchtime Club
- 9. After school clubs

Impact:

- 1. Take up of Breakfast club by those children eligible for FSM 70%.
- 2. Results for 2014 SATs show that children accessing Pupil Premium funding achieved 100% in SATs.
