School Year 2015/16

Pupil Premium was introduced in April 2011 and paid for by a specific grant based on school census figures for those children eligible for free school meals from Reception to Y11.

At Windmill Hill:

- We ensure that teaching and learning opportunities meet the needs of all pupils.
- We ensure that appropriate provision is made for pupils who belong to vulnerable groups, including those who might be considered to be socially disadvantaged, in order to raise the standard of achievement of these pupils.
- Pupil Premium will be allocated following a needs analysis which will identify priority classes, groups or individuals.
- All our work through Pupil Premium will be aimed at accelerating progress, moving children forward in order to achieve their full potential.

School Policy:

The Headteacher and the Governing Body have agreed a policy for Pupil Premium to guide the use of funds and to ensure that it represents value for money.

In 2015-16 the Pupil Premium funding allocation across the academic year was £107,697. This money was spent in the following ways:

- 1. Providing a free Breakfast Club.
- 2. Teaching Assistant
- 3. Intensive programme in Writing for small groups with an experienced provider.
- 4. All children at Windmill Hill are given high quality provision from professionals who teach: drumming, brass and woodwind tuition, dance, singing, drama and French.
- 5. Funding of a Speech and Language Therapist
- 6. Funding of a Behaviour Support specialist.
- 7. Lunchtime Club
- 8. Additional Infant Teacher
- 9. Nurture Group
- 10. Gardening club



Pupil Premium Targets for 2016/17:

- 3. Continued access to Behaviour Consultant
- 4. Purchase library resources
- 5. Continue to enable children to access high quality music, drama, dance and French provision.
